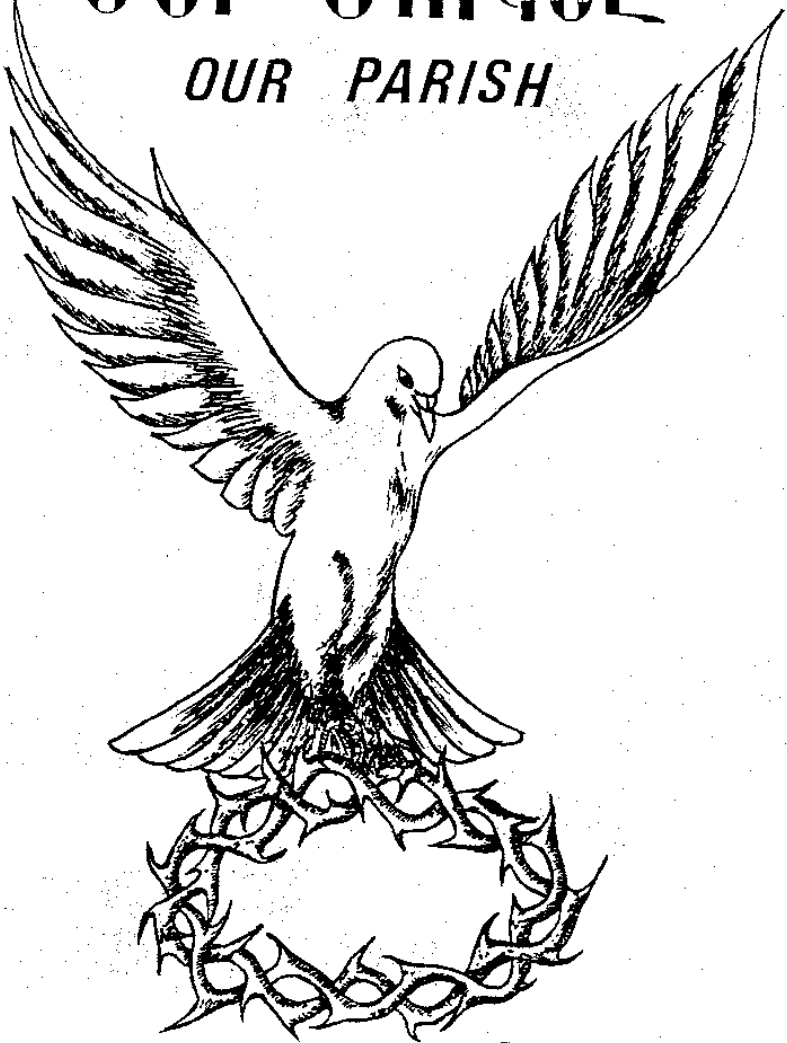

GREAT BRITAIN

An exposition of Armenian Manuscripts was held at the British Museum from the 11th of December to the 6th of March 1988. It was organized by Rev. Nerces Nercessian, Apostolic Parish Priest of St. Peter's church in London and Director of the "Christian Middle-East" section of the British Museum.

The Soviet economist Abel Aganbeguian*, has mentioned during a reception given to his honour by Nor Seround at London, that a special commission, which was asked to study the problem of Gharabagh, had concluded that on economical grounds it should be linked with Soviet Armenia rather than with Azerbaidjan.

ABEL AGANBEGUIAN, born in 1932 in Tiblissi, Georgia, had a difficult childhood. He was brought up by his uncle Ruben.

The new economic policy of Kremlin is essentially the work of Abel Aganbeguian. He has been thinking about it for many years now. He was Director of the Institute of Economics in Novossibirsk and in 1985, M. Gorbachev puts him to the head of the Economics Section of the Science Academy of USSR.

He is designated as "the best economist of USSR" and is working hard to actualize his old dream: to reform in depth the Soviet economy.

He has recently published a book: "Perestroika, the Soviet double challenge".
